





ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- COMPLETE A TOTAL OF 16 NCAA CORE COURSES IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS:
- 4 YEARS OF ENGLISH.
- + 3 YEARS OF MATH (ALGEBRA 1 OR HIGHER).
- + 2 YEARS OF NATURAL/PHYSICAL SCIENCE (INCLUDING ONE YEAR OF LAB SCIENCE IF OFFERED).
- + 2 YEARS OF SOCIAL SCIENCE.
- + 1 ADDITIONAL YEAR OF ENGLISH, MATH OR NATURAL/PHYSICAL SCIENCE.
- + 4 ADDITIONAL YEARS OF ENGLISH, MATH, NATURAL/PHYSICAL
- SCIENCE, SOCIAL SCIENCE, FOREIGN LANGUAGE, COMPARATIVE RELIGION OR PHILOSOPHY.

BEFORE 7TH SEMESTER

- COMPLETE 10 OF YOUR 16 CORE COURSES, INCLUDING <u>SEVEN</u> IN ENGLISH, MATH OR NATURAL/PHYSICAL SCIENCE, BEFORE THE START OF YOUR SEVENTH SEMESTER.
- ONCE YOU BEGIN YOUR SEVENTH SEMESTER, YOU MUST HAVE MORE THAN 10 CORE COURSES COMPLETED TO BE ABLE TO REPEAT OR REPLACE ANY OF THE 10 COURSES USED TO MEET THE 10/7 REQUIREMENT.



THE OFFER

- WILL BE VERY CLEAR. COLLEGE COACH ALMOST ALWAYS COMMUNICATES WITH COACH AND PLAYER. IF YOU ARE UNSURE CHECK WITH YOUR COACH
- University is required to put <u>in writing</u> and cannot be an officially extended until August 1 of Senior Year.
- SOMETIMES THERE ARE STIPULATIONS. THESE SHOULD BE CLEARLY COMMUNICATED.

OFFICIAL & UNOFFICIAL VISITS

Official visit. Any visit to a college campus by you and your parents paid for by the college. The college may pay all or some of the following expenses:

- Your transportation to and from the college;
- Room and meals (three per day) while you are visiting the college; and
- Reasonable entertainment expenses, including three complimentary admissions to a home athletics contest.

Before a college may invite you on an official visit, you will have to provide the college with a copy of your high school transcript (Division I only) and SAT, ACT or PLAN score and register with the Eligibility Center.

Unofficial visit. Any visit by you and your parents to a college campus paid for by you or your parents. The only expense you may receive from the college is three complimentary admissions to a home athletics contest. You may make as many unofficial visits as you like and may take those visits at any time. The only time you cannot talk with a coach during an unofficial visit is during a dead period.



VERBAL COMMITMENT & NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT

Verbal commitment. This phrase is used to describe a college-bound student-athlete's commitment to a school before he or she signs (or is able to sign) a National Letter of Intent. A college-bound student-athlete can announce a verbal commitment at any time. While verbal commitments have become very popular for both college-bound student-athletes and coaches, this "commitment" is NOT binding on either the college-bound student-athlete or the institution. Only the signing of the National Letter of Intent accompanied by a financial aid agreement is binding on both parties.

National Letter of Intent

The National Letter of Intent (NLI) is a voluntary program administered by the Eligibility Center. By signing an NLI, your son or daughter agrees to attend the institution for one academic year. In exchange, that institution must provide athletics financial aid for one academic year.

COLLEGE ADMISSION

- ADMISSION PROCESS IS JUST AS FOR A NON-ATHLETE —DO THIS IMMEDIATELY AFTER SIGNING
- SCHOOL CAN DENY ADMISSION FOR LACK OF ATTENDANCE IN HS, POOR BEHAVIOR IN HS, ILLEGAL ACTIVITY, ETC...
- FAFSA-DO THIS IMMEDIATELY AFTER 1040 IS COMPLETED. MAY HAVE TO DO TWICE; ONE FOR SUMMER SCHOOL AND ONE FOR FULL ACADEMIC YEAR.

THE BUSINESS OF COLLEGE ATHLETICS

- COLLEGES DECIDE WHO THEY WANT, NOT BUFORD
- CAPITAL INVESTMENT-NOT A VALUE COMPANY, BUT A GROWTH COMPANY
- MEASURABLES- COACHES HAVE TO TANGIBLY JUSTIFY THEIR INVESTMENT TO BOOSTERS AND MEDIA

THE BUSINESS OF COLLEGE ATHLETICS

- 5 CLASSES WORTH OF ATHLETES AND ONLY A FEW NEEDS
- 85 SCHOLARSHIPS-17 PER YEAR-15
 POSITIONS ON THE FIELD. SOME YEARS
 YOU WILL NOT SIGN A POSITION
- Losing coaches- Lose on field you get fired, lose in recruiting get fired
- SCHOLARSHIP ARE YEAR TO YEAR SOME SCHOOL ARE NOW GIVING 4 YEAR COMMITMENTS



MEDIA/INTERESTED PARTIES

- BE CAREFUL. RECRUITING IS A BIG BUSINESS. MEDIA WILL PUBLISH EVERYTHING YOU SAY. THERE IS NO "OFF THE RECORD."
- THE SCHOOL SHOULD BE TOLD WHAT YOU THINK BEFORE THE MEDIA.
- LET COACH BE A BUFFER
- FACEBOOK IS VERY PUBLIC. BE CAREFUL WHAT YOU TYPE. MAINTAIN POISE AND BE FILLED WITH CLASS, EVEN IF YOU THINK YOU ARE FACEBOOKING WITH A "FRIEND."

MEDIA/INTERESTED PARTIES

- YOU WILL SUDDENLY HAVE LOTS OF PEOPLE TRYING TO GET INFO.
- COMBINES-SOME GOOD/SOME BAD
- EVERY COMBINE IS NOT FOR YOU
- YOU DO NOT HAVE TO PARTICIPATE IN THEM, MEASURABLES MATTER. IT CAN HURT YOU.
